### **Nature of support**

**An enhanced learning lead is employed 2 days per week**

Individual students work on specific targets, follow bespoke programmes and Literacy strategies eg. Fast Track and Literacy Recovery Programme.

Support is also given to students with visits and transition to college

**Enrichment activities are timetabled for all students on a weekly basis**

Sports activities

Craft

Cookery

Art and Craft

Interactive story time

Tap dancing

**A range of specialist support sessions are available for pupils to be referred to**

Social interaction therapy

**Trips and special events in school**

Trips and in school events are planned throughout the year to support learning and introduce students to new environments and enriching experiences.

These are subsidised for pupil premium students to ensure that no pupil is excluded from valuable learning opportunities.

## Rationale

As a school we recognise that functional literacy underpins all learning. An enhanced learning lead supports a greater emphasis on the importance of reading and literacy throughout school and provides an individualised approach to students learning.

Students are referred by staff to specialised support sessions, which are able to focus their attention on specific, none academic areas of need. This is aimed to further support a child to be able to access learning more effectively.

Enrichment sessions allow pupils to explore a range of different activities and develop new skills and confidence which they will then be able to implement into general classroom learning.

Learning is supported by trips and in school activities by using pupil premium grants to subsidise these events it enables all of our pupils to access these learning opportunities.
